**Annual Tech Session**

**March 4th, 2017**

This years Tech Session had a Great Turnout. There were 30 People in attendance. It was a Great Session given by Dave Nock. Dave started the Tech Session with some basic things to always remember to check on our cars before heading out on the road.

Tires - Check the age, air pressure, and tread wear.

Hoses - Always carry a spare, lower hose can be cut and used for the upper hose.

Belts - Check for cracks and tightness.

Radiator Caps, Points, Rotors, Spark Plugs, should also be looked at when going for an extended trip.

Carburetors - Check for any noticeable leaks, also once they are adjusted they should be left alone.

Ken Painter's 1967 BJ8 was used for covering these items.

After a short break, Dave started his presentation on the Healey Transmission.


Most transmission problems develop in the first and reverse gears caused by grinding them when being engaged. When shifting into first or reverse gears, the motion should always be a silent move with no grinding.

Dave also explained the power flow of the transmission and which gears are being engaged as you shift while driving.

Dave also explained how the overdrive functions which is put into operation by an electric solenoid switch, while the actual operation of the overdrive is hydraulic. The fluid used to operate the overdrive is shared with the transmission.

The Tech Session ended with the group giving Dave a round of applause for his presentation on the Austin Healey Transmission. Thank You Dave for allowing the group to spend a Saturday Morning at your shop, and once again sharing your vast knowledge of our treasured cars.



# CHASING ERIKA THE RED By: John Soderling

I remember clearly the autumn day eighteen years ago, as a friend and I drove north on California Highway 101 in the early morning dawn bound for Eureka, with a cashier's check in my hip pocket and heart-throbbing anticipation in my chest. The motivation for this 300-mile odyssey was a red 1957 Austin Healey 100-Six I had located several months earlier in *Austin Healey Magazine* Marketplace.

As I turn off Hwy 101 into a driveway flanked by white picket fences and proceeded down the short lane there she is – brilliant red paint, polished chrome and glistening black tonneau! Immediately this sensuous looking car exudes a sensation of motion – just sitting there in the driveway. With a short “cat's paw like” overhang in front and a long, hunkered-down muscular looking rear, she appears like a big cat poised and ready to pounce. She's gorgeous from any angle.

Thus begins “The Journey”. With the title in my hip pocket, heart-throbbing exhilaration in my chest and 300 miles to San Francisco, I head south on Hwy 101 letting her stretch her over-drive, long legs at 3000 rpm. By high noon “Erika the Red” and I are busting down Hwy 1, the Pacific Coast Highway, with 200 miles of sinuous road ahead, 200 decibels of raucous blatting tailpipe symphonics behind and awesome Pacific Ocean vistas to the right.

Accelerating into a tight turn 20 mph over the advisory speed, it's hard to believe that mere rubber street tires are tethering us to this planet. This is crude but highly effective intoxication. Busting along in this open lusty roadster I think it sure is one hell of a windy day - and then I notice the flags atop the buildings in Fort Bragg are hanging limp. What a pity there's only 150 miles left to San Francisco.

The road straightens momentary onto a hogback ridge and I take a furtive glance at the cockpit. A big ol' three spoke Brooklands style steering wheel. The odd trafficator lever. The Starter button. The overdrive switch and escutcheon. A chrome grab handle for apprehensive passengers. The simple yet elegant, symmetrically arranged Smiths gauges. There's something about being behind the wheel of this primitive roadster that seems capable of transporting me back to a more civilized time, one before monster traffic jams, road rage, air bags and cup-holders. Downshift, brake, accelerate, upshift. Mendocino. Point Arena. Gualala. What a pity there's only 100 miles left to SF.

It's a silly simple formula for adventurous, ham-fisted driving. Mix in a ton of Coker sculpted aluminum and steel, a big honking lump of long-stroke Austin iron, six hours of California sun and 200 miles of twisting two-lane PCH. As with moonshine, nobody but nobody can ignore its visceral rush! Fort Ross. Bodega Bay. Inverness. What a pity there's only 50 miles left to SF. Descending a last few sinuous miles along the Marin County coast, I am treated to momentary views of the last rays of a setting sun highlighting the Golden Gate Bridge and exhilarating exhaustion. It's all about “The Journey”.

So, what is “The Journey”? It implies a certain sense of adventure in our travels and it demands a ride with a semblance more of romance than efficiency, plus the appreciation of interesting vintage machinery and the unreeling of new vistas. Above all, it asks for a vintage roadster that begs to be driven, when we really have nowhere we need to go. Yes, It's all about “The Journey”. **Thank you DMHI!**
