




















Special Invitations

If you haven't been to a club event recently you may get a special invitation email to club events near you. The club really benefits when members participate (even if they drive a Honda/Toyota/Chevy/Dodge/Ford/BMW/Porsche/whatever BJ9). So, BJ9s are welcome at all club events! For those unfamiliar, BJ9s are ANY non-Healey (even minivans and rentals). Don't feel slighted if your BJ9 isn't included in a group car picture (this is an Austin Healey club after all). We'd really like to see you at a club event even if your Healey can't make it.

Flash Drives

Flash Drives are impromptu drives that a club member leads on interesting roads or to interesting destinations (kinda like a Flash Mob with a Healey). If you're planning to drive your Healey to some interesting or fun place or to a non-club event consider volunteering to be a Flash Drive leader. The club member wanting to lead a Flash Drive should email Marc at events.ggahc@gmail.com to announce the drive. Please give Marc at least three or four days' notice, provide the meeting time and place, and a general route description (extra credit if you provide a marketing blurb). Marc will send out a club-wide email with the information provided by the Flash Drive leader announcing the Flash Drive. Interested participants should RSVP the Flash Drive leader and show up at the specified time and place AND DRIVE together. Flash Drive leaders should commit and not cancel or back out of the Flash Drive (even if members don't RSVP) and let Marc and Mike Sonneman know who shows up (extra credit if you email a picture or two from the drive). Note that Flash Drives aren't "official" club events but they are an opportunity for club members to enjoy each other's company with their Healeys. Flash Drive participants are responsible for their own cars AND SAFETY.

Annual Mileage Award

The Annual Mileage Award will be presented at the Christmas Party to the club member that drives their Healey the most during the year. Interested members should notify Marc before the West Marin Opener and/or at the Late-February/Early-March Tech Session AND they must drive their Healey to the event. Marc will inspect and record the mileage from your odometer. Participants can periodically email Marc a photo of their odometer throughout the year if they'd like and he may publish your mileage in the Newsletter or in club-wide emails but this is not necessary for participation (sand-baggers welcome!). The winner will be the participant that has the highest documented/certified mileage at the Christmas Party.

The 100%er Club recognizes club members that participate in ALL OFFICIAL CLUB ACTIVITIES. During the Christmas Party and in the year-end Newsletter the 100%er Club Members will be recognized. Mike Sonneman does a great job keeping track of event attendees so if you attend an event please sign the attendance sheet to let him know you're there - "Drivers" and "Navigators" alike.

Member Name Badges

The club is going to revive Club Member Name Badges - but you MUST QUALIFY! The good news is that qualifying is FUN. You just need to participate in 5 official club events. The name badges will display the club logo and your name and will be presented to the qualifying members. It would be great if members wore their name badges proudly at club events and at other motor-related events to let other people know what gang you roll with. Plus it helps new members (and forgetful members) know who you are.

Tri-Valley Beer Trail !!!

Meet: Sunday, May 6, 10:30 AM, McDonald's, 2905 Grove Way, Castro Valley

In a partial break from our traditional wine tasting, John & Cathy Turney will be leading us on a tour of the Tri-Valley (Pleasanton/Livermore area) Beer Trail, followed with a stop at a new, exciting winery. The Tri-Valley Beer Trail is a growing collection of 22 craft breweries, taprooms, and restaurants from Danville to Livermore. This is California's newest beer trail, where we will be sampling flights of local brews, and speaking with brewmasters in a laid-back environment.

The first part of our trip will test your steering as we start in Castro Valley and wind through the East Bay hills on a scenic drive to the Main Street Brewery in Pleasanton for lunch and our first tastes of their offerings. Their menu includes salads, burgers, hot and deli sandwiches, and eight microbrews that they make. (Yes, they also serve wine and non-alcoholic beverages.)

From there we move on to Shadow Puppet Brewing Company, located in Livermore. They are a family-owned craft brewery dedicated to bringing artisan beers to beer aficionados and novices alike. Their brewmaster has offered to give us a tour of the facility and the various types of brews that they produce!

Finally, we will take more scenic roads to Byron to visit an exciting new winery. How exciting? They won six awards in the San Francisco Chronicle Wine Competition 2018, they also brew beer, and they are really nice people!

ALL BRITISH MOTORING SHOW AND SWAP MEET

And you don't need to be a secret agent to find what you need in our swap meet, filled with all sorts of new and used parts, cars and accessories. So keep up the British end and register your vehicle now to join the largest gathering of British motoring in Northern California.

1955 Austin Healey 100S

Owner: Robert E. Griffin D.D.S. Chassis Number: AHS3802

All Austin Healey 100S sports cars were produced between February and July of 1955, although several prototypes were produced in 1954. The prototype 100S was officially timed by the American Automobile Association at a mean speed of 143.1 MPH over the measured mile at Bonneville in August 1954. With this record established 49 cars and 7 works cars capable of high speed and endurances were produced. Unfortunately, less than 30 cars are known to exist today with less than 10 in the United States.



The 100S was quite advanced for the period with an all alloy body and sub frame members above the chassis, four-wheel disc brakes and a 51/49 front to rear weight distribution.

Prominent SCCA racers of the day purchased the first cars: Briggs Cunningham, Jackie Cooper, Bob Fergus, Fred Allen, Vince Sardi, and Jim Ferguson. The majority of the cars were painted Old English White with Lobelia (blue) sides, the American racing colors. There were three notable exceptions: Briggs Cunningham's car (AHS3501) was white with a Lobelia stripe down the center. Jim Ferguson's car (AHS3503) was all red as he was from Canada, and Jackie Cooper's car (AHS3504) was a special request of Spruce Green.

First Owner: John Barnes Mull (1901-1973) of Malvern, Pennsylvania purchased the car from Royston Distributers in Philadelphia in 1955. He raced the car in SCCA events on the East Coast (Watkins Glen, Cumberland, Thompson, Beverly, etc.) along with his AC Bristols and Jaguars. His wife Evelyn (1931-1991) was quite an accomplished driver in her own right and was very active in advocating women to race sports cars. She published a book in 1958 titled "Women in Sports Car Competition". In late 1956, John sold the car to Thomas P. Luck.

Second Owner: Thomas P. Luck also raced at Watkins Glen and Allentown in 1956. He sold the car in late 1957 or early 1958 to Fred Losse.

Third Owner: Cdr. Fred L. Losse, a Navy dentist, was an original member of the well-known "Lavender Hill Mob". This was a group of Washington D.C. SCCA Region members who brought organized (and sometimes disorganized) sports car racing to the capital area. To name but a few members: 1. Dr. Dick Thompson (another dentist) who raced at Le Mans six times, won the 1000 kilometer race at Spa in 1956 with Jackie Ickx, and established the Corvette as a true race car. 2. Charlie Wallace, a well known Porsche and Jaguar driver. 3. Bill Kincheloe, a championship Healey 3000 driver.

Prior to acquiring the 100S, Dr. Losse raced at Cad Allard, Veritas and Alfa Romeo at numerous race tracks on the East Coast along with John Mull. Dr. Losse's daughter remembers him racing the car on the East Coast as well as her father introducing her to Sterling Moss.

Dr. Losse was transferred to New Zealand in 1958 and raced the car there as well as allowing a professional driver (Graham Pierce) to use the car in events. He left the car in New Zealand when he came back to the States in 1960. Between 1978 and 1979, AHS3802 was a regular competitor at many major New Zealand events, including no less than four Terratonga Grand Prix races. The car remained in New Zealand with various owners until 1981 when it was transported to Australia. The owner Murray Wells, who had seen the car when he lived in New Zealand, raced it in Vintage events until 1997.

I purchased the car from Murray in 2000. Fortunately, it was still in it's original condition, although somewhat the worse for wear. After many years of racing, I felt it deserved a complete frame up restoration to the exact condition it existed when it left England for the United States over five decades ago. Tom Kovacs of Fourintune (who has restored four 100S's, including the Jackie Cooper car) did an impeccable restoration, as the awards and events can attest.

The historic Danish village of Solvang offers the best of the Santa Ynez Valley and <u>Santa Barbara wine</u> <u>country</u> in a relaxed and peaceful setting. Indulge in authentic Danish pastries at the world-famous bakeries. Stroll through the village and admire the oldworld European architecture, plus find the perfect souvenir at a variety of <u>charming boutiques and shops</u>.





Fall is typically beautiful in the Santa Ynez Valley. We plan to have some beautiful drives through back roads in the Valley, with the option of visiting several of the many vineyards for wine tasting. In addition to Solvang, we will visit Buellton, Los Olives and other locations in the valley.
