We had another Great turnout for this Event, and a Great Event it was... It started with a nice drive through the area and on to Skyline Blvd... The views of the Bay Bridge and San Francisco were spectacular... If you haven't taken this drive I encourage you to do so, it is well worth the time and effort to get there...

Once we reached the USS Hornet and made our way on to the ship, we were guided to one of the mess halls for our lunch... We had some sandwiches with chips and potato salad, which was pretty darn good...

As we were eating our lunch Janelle Sahr and her friend Dave told us about some of their experiences working as volunteers to restore the ship for all of us to enjoy today... After lunch was done, we took a short tour of the ship with Janelle and Dave and saw many of the areas in which they did their work...

After our time with Janelle & Dave was up, we ventured around the ship and took in the flight deck and walked out to the end of the ship to take a look at the nice views... After returning to the conning tower, we asked one of the Docents if we could see the Combat Information Center (CIC room), which Janelle & Dave helped restore to how it looked when it was in use...

A gentleman named Allen took us to the room and explained what operations took place there, and that there were 24 people working in the room when it was fully operational... It was an impressive thing to see and think of how chaotic it must have been to work in there...

After our visit Allen asked us if we would like to go out on the flight deck and see the Fresnal Lens Optical Landing System and the work he had done to restore the Landing Signal Officers station that was used to guide the planes in for landing...

As he was explaining how the system worked he shared with us that he had been a pilot on the Midway and had made approximately 375 take off and landings on the ship flying an F4 Phantom Fighter Jet... He told us that they graded the pilots for how accurate they were at making their landings and catching the third wire with their tail hooks...

He told us that once the ship made port and the guys were out having some refreshments that the guys who made the highest grades were taken care of by the other pilots... When we asked him how that worked out for him he smiled and said he didn't ever buy many drinks...

After our time was up with Allen, he asked us if we had signed up for a tour of the conning tower, and he turned us over to another Docent named Allen who took us on that tour... We got to see where the Air Boss sat and he gave us an explanation of the activities that took place there...

He also told us that the Air Boss watched the men on the deck to make sure they were in their proper positions and performing their duties as required... If one of the men were out of position or the Air Boss determined they were not performing their duties, they would get called up to have a little chat with him... He was nice enough to share with us that he did get to experience that himself at one time...

When the tour concluded we made our way back to the Hanger Deck and did a little more exploring... The Air Stream trailer that was used to quarantine the astronauts was there as well as a small room they had made for President Nixon and the First Lady Patricia when they came on board to greet the returning astronauts...

If you have not visited the USS Hornet I encourage you to do so... It is a wonderful piece of History and it is one of the most decorated ships in the US Navy... In 1969 the USS Hornet was used in the recovery of Apollo 11 space capsule and its astronauts, and again a few months later in the recovery of the Apollo 12 space capsule and its astronauts...

In 1991, the USS Hornet was designated a National Historic Monument and in 1998 she opened as a museum... I would like to Thank all who were involved in making this event happen... A big Thank You to Gerry Silva and his sister Wendy Swain for organizing the event and also to Janelle Sahr and Dave for spending time with us and sharing their experiences as volunteers working on the ship... X

He leaves behind a daughter and son, a son in law, five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, and his love of all things Healey. It was a peaceful ending, as Loren told one last joke before lying down to sleep. He never woke up and passed away the next day just after noon.

For many years, Loren was a fixture in the Austin Healey Clubs, starting with the Austin Healey Club Pacific Center. He was there when it was founded and later served as Treasurer, Vice-President and then President of the club. Similarly, he filled many of the same roles within the Golden Gate Austin Healey Club.

He drove his '65 3000 wide and far, including a Rendezvous in St Louis, a meet in Park City Utah as well as West Coast Meets in San Diego, Lake Tahoe and Oregon. He generally found good weather and a sturdy car, but loved to tell about getting a flat while driving through Yellowstone National Park, and miraculously a tow truck stopped who had a tube the right size and the knowledge to repair the flat without breaking the spokes, which allowed him to get back on the road.

Despite his infirmities, he had plans for his car, installing LED lighting, hazard flashers, upgrading the sound system and correcting a transmission leak. Despite his failing health he wanted to upgrade and improve his car up to the very end.



Departure Sept. 14, arrival in Madras Sept. 16

I realize that the 2018 Healey Rendezvous in Madras, OR is a long way off, <u>Sept. 16 to Sept. 21</u>, but for those wishing to caravan to Madras the following is a schedule for a convoy. We plan to take it easy with the driving and are allowing to be there on the third day. (First event day)

Day1 – Meeting point at Granzellas Restaurant in Williams, CA.

Then drive 72 miles to first overnight in Red Bluff, CA. Day 2 - 171 miles, Day 3 - 180 miles.

Day 1, (Sept. 14) 72 miles and the distance from your home to Williams, CA

The first day meeting point will be at Granzellas Restaurant, at 11:30 am on Hwy. 5 in Williams, CA.

Williams is not a very large town and the restaurant is easy to find. Some people are already coming some distance from their home to Williams so after lunch we plan to drive another 72 miles and overnight in Red Bluff, CA. (Listed Motel rates may change in summer)

Day 3, (Sept. 16) 180 miles

Klamath Falls, OR. à Madras, OR. (180 miles / 3hrs. 30 min.)


