Elkhorn Peak Cellars

Saturday - August 17th, 2019

Napa, California



It turned out to be a beautiful day in Napa. The group had a nice time meandering around and chatting while enjoying some very nice wines, with some cheese and crackers.

Then it was time to have some lunch. The lunch included some Brisket, Pulled Pork, Beans, Ciabatta Bread, Potato Salad, and lots and lots of cupcakes. There was also some tasty BBQ sauce to choose from that included regular and spicy.

Elkhorn Peak Cellars was started in 1983 when Ken & Faith Nerlove purchased an old sheep ranch in Jamieson Canyon in South Napa. At the time there were no vineyards in Jamison Canyon on the property, so Ken decided to plant some Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grapes.

By 1986 the two acre vineyard was thriving, so they decided to purchase another six acres of land. Their first harvest was in 1987. From 1987 to 1992 the winery gained recognition for growing a limited production, very high quality fruit.

In 1994 Ken decided to create a label of his own and started Elkhorn Peak Cellars. The winery is named after Elkhorn Peak Mountain located just behind their vineyards. In 1997 the winery's first vintage was a 1994 Pinot Noir which gained great acclaim upon it's release.

From 2000 to 2015 the winery earned many awards from National Wine Competitions. Some of the awards included: Wine Enthusiast in 2009, Beverage Testing Institute in 2011, Double Gold 2010 from the SF Chronicle Wine Competition, and 4 Stars Exceptional in 2010.

Ken & Faith farm 10 acres of premium Pinot Noir grapes on their Estate Vineyard, which produces 800 cases of Elkhorn Peak Cellars Pinot Noir.

They are very happy and have no plans to expand; their emphasis is on growing and making limited production, ultra-premium wines. Their fruit and wine continue to be one of Napa's best kept secrets.

The weather was great, and everyone had a great time in a beautiful setting while enjoying some fine wine, good food, and time with friends.



Richmond played a significant part in the World War II home front. And the National Park Service recognizes Richmond's and women's World War II effort at...

The four Richmond shipyards built by Henry J. Kaiser produced 747 ships, more than any other shipyard complex in the country.



We can visit the S.S. Red Oak Victory (nearby at 1337 Canal Blvd, Berth 5, Richmond, CA

\$10 self-guided tour) a WWII era cargo vessel that was built in the Richmond Shipyards.

A little more background history:

Richmond was also home to over 56 different war industries, more than any other city of its size in the United States. The city grew from less than 24,000 people in 1940 to nearly 100,000 people by 1943 (a 296% increase in three years!), overwhelming the available housing, roads, schools, businesses and community services. To meet the critical housing shortage, the Richmond Housing Authority was incorporated on January 24, 1941. The program consisted of 20 housing projects, including apartments, dormitories, and three trailer parks. Most of these housing units were meant to be temporary, and no longer exist but the Atchison Village was designed to be a permanent housing complex. Kaiser also provided child care for families working in his shipyards. Funding to build the child care centers was provided by the United States Maritime Commission. The centers incorporated early-childhood education programming, nutritional meals and snacks, on-site nurses, art lessons, and family counseling.

Then it is off to another unique winery that is one of our personal favorites Oak Farm Vineyards.




Where we will have a private tasting and the use of their Bocci Ball Courts. After that, when you are ready, it is only a short drive to I-5 for your trip home.




