IN MEMORIUM: Glen Stephenson


Hopefully most of you will remember the recent profile about Glenn that appeared in the August 2022 edition of Healey Happenings. Glenn was sure animated during the interview! In late August he called me to thank the Club for the chance to tell his story. I tried to call him back but received a message from Helen that he was in the hospital, but expected to recover. When I returned from Europe I received the tragic news of his death. His wife, Karen, asked that the message below be shared with all Club members.

Glenn had a love affair with the Austin Healey since 1959 and he put in his order for one the following year. Since then, he has always had a 'Big' Healey; something about the sound, the sleek body style, the feeling the driver receives joining in the power as you motor down the coast highway. He would have a smile as he recalled various stories about his escapades while drag racing and setting world class records in his first Healey. I will fondly recall the stories.

Glenn died suddenly on 10/23/22 while getting ready to be discharged from the hospital. I will miss riding as his navigator; Glenn's love for the AH made each adventure memorable.

Glenn enjoyed participating in the club's activities. Thanks to all the club members who joined us on the two runs that we organized over the years; one we ended at Nile's Canyon Railway and the other at the SS Red Oak Victory ship at the Richmond harbor.

For those of you willing to lead a tour there are a couple of handy apps for helping to run events and documenting the event for inclusion in HH. One that Dave Nock introduced was **Life 360** (https:// www.life360.com/), while designed for families and similar groups, it allows real time tracking of phone locations so a group can all enter individual phone numbers and anyone can see where others are at any time. Very helpful for a leader to track participants, allows reporting accidents, breakdowns, etc. A 'free' membership is required (i.e. entering your phone ##).

Polarsteps (https://www.polarsteps.com/) is designed to track your movements via your phone and allows you to insert photos that correspond to your geolocation. It is simple to use, and is designed to record vacations, etc. Haden and I used it in Europe this past summer. It is perfect for longer trips and recording blogs. Your posts are accessible via a link that you distribute as desired, and if you want a glossy coffee table top book the quality is excellent. We intend to use it for the forthcoming EHM 2023 tour. Examples of the output are shown on the web page.

What3Words (https://what3words.com/) is another fun and useful one using geo location to define a 10 square foot precise location. Saving a table at Goodwood for your crew? Send them a link and they can find you by the time the appetizers arrive.

The GGAHC Annual Holiday Lunch



Planning for December's annual Xmas lunch started in the first trimester of the year with numerous good ideas as venues and locations. The normal considerations and circumstances became part of the discussion: location, access, the loci of member residences, drive time, appeal, etc., not the least of which was the ability to handle our typical crowd and costs. Many were chosen for consideration. Few survived the gauntlet. In the end the Eagle Vines Golf Club won the contest, with both an accommodating attitude, a 'right sized' venue, great setting in the Napa wine country, and reasonable access to a large portion of the Bay Area member basis. Those on the southern perimeter may have been challenged by driving distance/time, but for those to the East and North access was reasonable: neither Garmin nor Google Maps were necessary. One turn off of Highway 12 put one directly into the ample parking lot and a short walk to the clubhouse portico. The room hosting the crowd had uninterrupted views to the southeast across the course and vineyards.

For the golfers among us (Mr. Sonneman?) the course was designed by Johnny Miller, a top rated pro in the 1970's now retired and living in Monterey, and is among the better rated courses in the Bay Area. It is located directly adjacent to the private member Chardonnay club.



Long time local member Bea Kempe came as our guest, as well as our son Haden, a recent inductee into the long haul Healey event mystic (Goodwood to Tuscany), who has been selected to lead a portion of the Scandinavian tour in 2023, and exemplar of Marc's efforts to pass the Healey mystic to the Next Generation.

The service was great, and the Tri-Tip main course received accolades. The general consensus was the Club should become the 'go to' venue for next year, which makes the job of the planning committee easier. In total 54 dedicated Healey acolytes braved the uncertain weather to make the trek, the vast majority opting for the comfort of enclosed vehicles with good windshield wipers, defrosters, and weather protection. Len Harnett braved the deluges on I-5 and brought his Healey, but few others were so persuaded.



There was a somber passing of the leadership torch. As most of you now know Dave decided to retire as club President after numerous years in that role, capping a long term dedication to the club which started in 1987 as Historian. Obviously, Dave's dedication was preceded by his father Norm who established British Car Repair in the 1950's, a shop that has helped keep all of our aging rides on the road for most of their (and our) lives. While one may assume Dave has decided to concentrate on the core mission of wrenching on British Steel in reality he and Marc merely switched roles. So who has the most responsibility and dedicated time to the club? We will let them, and their ever-patient wives Jerri and Patti settle that debate. Whomever is declared the winner the club is the beneficiary of the selfless hours and efforts required to keep the wheels rolling. Make sure you thank them, as well as all board members, with an "ata boy" at your next encounter.

Fosters Bighorn & Railroad Museum Tour

It was Saturday, Sept 10th at 9:00 A.M. The group of Healey's and their drivers were ready to roll. As we set off on our journey, we were going to uncharted places. There is an old levee road that leads through an area which includes many old marina's that are in a state of disrepair. The road was in fairly good condition, which is more than I can say about the many vessels in the delta water. I thought it would be fun to do a little exploring on our way to the Western Railway Museum, so we ventured down W. Brannan Island Road. The road weaves around the Delta, and under Hwy 12, and after a brief drive on Hwy 12 we ended up in Isleton on Hwy 160 and then returned to Hwy 12. We continued down Hwy 12 on our way to Suisun City, home of the Western Railway Museum.



Our 50-minute Interurban train ride took us down the Old Sacramento Northern Railroad, an electric line that once ran between San Francisco, Sacramento & Chico. The 11-mile round trip rolls through the Solano County countryside, with its pristine, unchanged farmland and its views of Mount Diablo and the surrounding Marshlands. Their operating fleet consists of trains dating anywhere from 80 to 110 years old.

After the trip was completed, we were taken into the Rail Car Display House and the Exhibit Hall Building, which contained some old Pullman Train Cars. They were in great condition and you could see why they were so nice to travel in, back in the day. Upon arriving at the Western Railway Museum, we all purchased our ticket to ride on the '4001' Electric Train Car. The trip was not real long, but it was interesting. We learned about a small church along the tracks that had burned down. In order to pay for the rebuilding of the church, cemetery plots were sold to cover the costs of the rebuild.



When our visit at the museum was finished, we got into our cars, and drove back down Hwy 12 to Rio Vista for some chow. We had some tables reserved for lunch at Foster's Big Horn.

If you haven't been there before you are in for a treat. The restaurant and bar are filled with over 300 specimens of animal heads which were hunted by Bill Foster, back in the 1930's and 1940's. It is definitely a one of a kind place.
